This is a short legal information session suitable for anyone interested in the impacts of pesticides and their regulation, including pollution and the Environmental Protection Act.

The session will outline laws that regulate pesticides, and answer frequently asked questions.

Pesticides are used widely in Australian agriculture to protect crops and livestock from insects and weeds and are often used by public authorities on public land and in private homes and gardens. Pesticides have the potential to cause adverse environmental and human health effects, particularly when pesticide residues move offsite from where they are applied by spray drift or in runoff.
