## TRAINING FOR COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENT GROUPS

### WORKSHOP PURPOSE

The Environment Defenders Office (Victoria) Ltd (EDO) provides legal advice and representation to individuals and community groups working to protect the environment.

The purpose of the EDO **VCAT Planning & Environment Appeals** workshops is to improve the capacity of individuals and community-based conservation groups to be able to represent themselves in matters before VCAT that relate to planning and environment law appeals.

Attendees will learn how to participate most effectively in a VCAT proceeding.

### WORKSHOP FORMAT

The 2-hour program is presented by EDO lawyers.

The workshop includes a presentation with plenty of opportunity and encouragement for questions and participation in discussion by workshop attendees.

A group-hosted workshop focuses upon looking at the specific situation that faces your community group and the relevant laws and policies that apply.

A group of 15 to 20 participants is recommended.

### WORKSHOP CONTENT

Attendees are given practical and legally-focused information about VCAT proceedings and hearings. The program is flexible and topics can be tailored to meet the needs and interests of workshop attendees.

**Topics can include** (but are not limited to):

- an overview of the Victorian Planning and Environment Law System, the *Planning and Environment Act 1987*, and Victorian Planning Schemes.
- information about decision makers, third party rights, and appeals in the Victorian planning arena.
- a detailed look at the review body, the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal ("VCAT").
